Congratulations on your upcoming marriage! Music is an integral element to Catholic worship and plays an important role in your wedding liturgy. Music has a great power to lift the heart and mind to God, for the edification of those present at the wedding, and to adorn this most beautiful sacrament of matrimony.

Please note that the basic wedding music fee is \$350, which covers planning with the Director of Sacred Music, and an organist and cantor for your wedding Mass, ceremony, or convalidation. Typically, the Director of Sacred Music will be the organist and cantor for all weddings at St. John Paul II Scioto unless otherwise arranged and approved at least 3-months in advance. See the St. John Paul II Scioto Wedding Guidelines (revised May 2025) for additional guidelines and information. For those desiring more elaborate choral or instrumental music, these situations can be assessed case-by-case in collaboration with the Director of Sacred Music.

All wedding music in a Catholic wedding Mass or ceremony must align with the Church's teaching that Sacred Music must be truly *sacred*, that is, set apart and ordered to the worship of God. This means we must leave to the side any music which is profane (worldly), sentimental, or otherwise "personal" rather than universally sacred and beautiful. Therefore, popular music, secular music, things you hear on the radio, your favorite movie theme – these can be enjoyed at the reception, but do not belong in the sanctuary. Instead, we select beautiful and dignified sacred music that fits the Church's criteria.

To help you plan a beautiful wedding, we have provided a list of selections from which you may choose for your wedding music. Representative recordings are provided for your reference.
